For over 15 years, the space school has consistently provided students from over 25 countries opportunities to work in a multicultural environment while listening to astronauts and distinguished space professionals of life science, physical science, engineering, law, and business.

In addition to the curriculum including tours of NASA's Johnson Space Center and numerous cultural events, each delegate is hosted by a pre-screened family in the surrounding area of activity, allowing full integration into the societal environment.

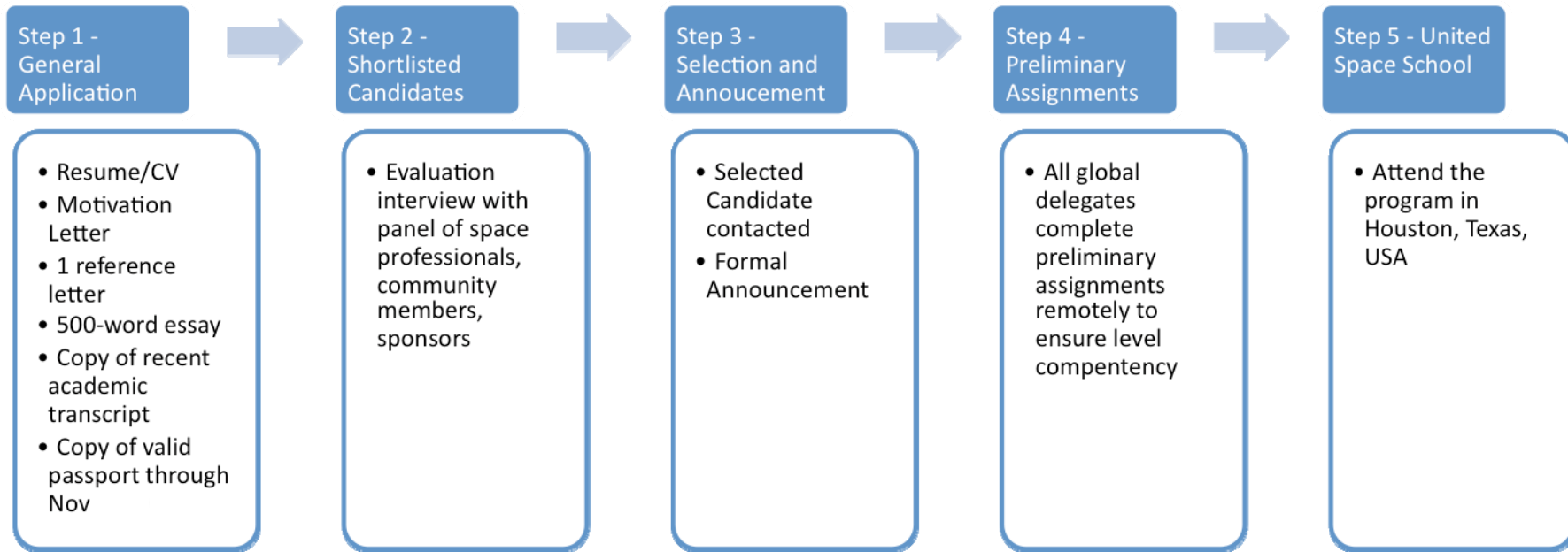

Candidates should be **enrolled in an accredited high school** & be between **16 to 18 years of age** as of January 1, 2011

Candidates should **exhibit attributes** of:

- Public speaking (Second language is an asset)
- Interest in and enthusiasm for space & aerospace
- Multicultural interaction

Candidates should prepare a **500-word essay** on the following topic:

- Future use of the International Space Station
